Vision

To continue being the leading institution on Partnership training within NATO Education & Training Community and multinational operational training.

Mission

To provide training and education support to NATO, Partner Nations, national personnel, and when required, to participants from other countries in order to contribute to the attainment of interoperability objectives and to enhance military cooperation in accordance with NATO and Turkish General Staff (TGS) policy and principles.

Courses (Residential and Online)

PTC-TÜR continues to be a meeting point for NATO, NATO Partners and other UN members. PTC-TÜR has reached a number of participants exceeding 23.000, both military and civilian, from 108 different countries through the successful implementation of more than 650 courses, and 76 mobile training activities in 19 different countries so far. The staff of the PTC-TÜR is dedicated to provide our participants qualitative training and education with a team of highly qualified experts, lecturers, instructors and prominent guest speakers from national and international military/civilian organizations and universities.

Our participants can also find the opportunity of taking part in field trainings at different military units in Türkiye. There will be visits to military and governmental organizations during our some courses. In addition the education and training activities, our participants will be offered to participate in special tours to unique historical and cultural places across Türkiye.

Advanced Distributed Learning (ADL)

In addition to its resident courses, PTC-TÜR contributes to NATO's ADL efforts with its online "The Law of Armed Conflict Course".

Mobile Training Teams (MTT)

As the leading institution in the area of Mobile Training Team (MTT) Activities, PTC-TÜR have conducted a total of 76 MTT Activities, in 19 different countries, with more than 2.700 participants, since 2002. Within this context, PTC-TÜR is capable of conducting MTT Activities, in order to meet the Nation's training requirements on Civil Military Cooperation (CIMIC), Peace Support Operations (PSO) and Military Instructor Training Course related issues.



As a follow-up to “1994 NATO Brussels Summit”, Türkiye decided to establish a “PfP Training Center” and declared its decision at the Euro Atlantic Partnership Council (EAPC) meeting in Portugal on 30 May 1997. Turkish PfP Training Center was inaugurated on 29 June 1998 with an international opening ceremony and has the honor of being the first recognized partnership training center by NATO on 12 February 1999.

We were also the first Partnership Training Center to introduce Mobile Training Programs in 2002. We continue to conduct these mobile training activities with military institutions of NATO members and partner nations in order to share Turkish peace support operations experiences, also to enhance interoperability with our partners and to support bilateral military relations.

Since its establishment, PfP Training Center has been actively contributing to Partnership initiatives by conducting courses, mobile training activities and seminars for the members of NATO, PfP, Mediterranean Dialogue (MD), İstanbul Cooperation Initiative (ICI), Partners across the Globe (PatG) and countries that Türkiye has bilateral relationship. As a justification of our quality approach, PTC-TÜR has been awarded with the “NATO Quality Assurance Unconditional Accreditation Certificate”. With the Quality Assurance Accreditation, it has been assured that PTC-TÜR’s organizational process and procedures meet the education and training quality assurance standards developed by NATO.

Education and training activities are conducted with the professional support of highly qualified experts, lecturers, instructors/guest speakers from national and international military/civilian organizations and universities through;



All participants will be accommodated at the Officers' Club unless otherwise requested by the participants.

All sicknesses or accidents will be referred to civilian medical facilities at your own expense. Therefore, all participants are advised to have a medical insurance. Financial Assistance

Participants whose nation does not have Financial Aid Agreement and/or bilateral Military Training and Cooperation Agreement with the Republic of Türkiye and personnel who are not financially supported by NATO shall pay course fee and administrative fee. Those personnel also will be responsible for covering international transportation, meal and accommodation expenditures. Course fee and administrative fee are being paid "in cash" during the course.

Dress Code

Transportation

Participants are requested to fax or email their flight itineraries at least one week prior to the course start date. You will be welcomed and seen off at the airport according to your flight schedule. Transportation details will be explained in the confirmation letter. During the course, domestic transportation between Officers' Club and PFP Training Center will be provided by PFP Training Center (Host Nation support).

Other

You are always required to carry a valid passport or a NATO Travel Order with an ID card. Ensure through your national authorities that above-mentioned documents are valid. All participants are advised to carry a credit card or a debit card since Turkish Officers' Clubs do not accept cash.

The participants from those countries which are not parties to NATO/SOFA and/or PFP/SOFA or which do not have any Bilateral Military Training and Cooperation Agreement with the Republic of Türkiye shall be treated in accordance with Turkish Domestic Legislation during their stay in Türkiye.




